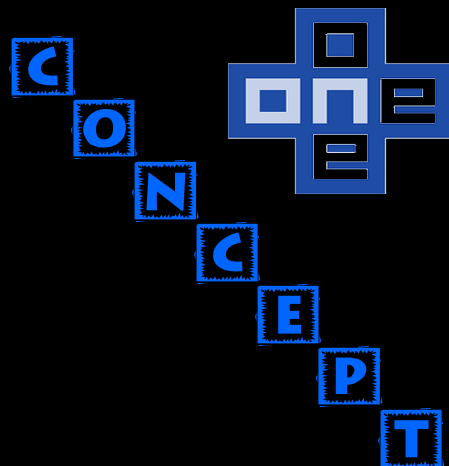

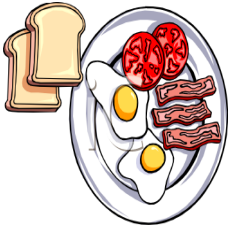

Heard it through the Grapevine
January, 2016

As we enter this new year of 2016, I am reminded of the “Prayer for Peace”, found on page 99 of the Twelve and Twelve. We recently read this prayer at a meeting and at its conclusion, I was struck by how selfless its thoughts and words were. My second thought was how impossible it would be for me to emulate all these seemingly unattainable qualities in my own life. And finally, my last thought was the Preamble of our program which states, “we are not saints”. How alcoholic my thinking still is! If it looks like work, sounds like work, and requires work, maybe I’ll just forget about it for a long, long time.

But let me get out of my own thoughts on the prayer and write of those further shared at the meeting. Quite possibly we believe in our most human and compassionate hearts that we do truly wish to capture and practice the principles of the prayer. But where do we start and how can we move into action? A member at the meeting suggested starting with the very first phase of the prayer, “Lord, make me a channel of thy peace”, and quite simply, endeavoring to do more peaceful things. How simplistic this thought was as well as a reminder that perhaps I don’t need to tackle the entire prayer all at once. Instead I can take one line at a time, meditate on it, ask for understanding of the thought, and move through my days focusing on one principle at a time. In my desire to change my alcoholic thoughts and the way I act, perhaps I will learn more patience and understanding, how to listen more closely and less judgmentally to others and in fact grow more peaceful. When I feel comfortable, then I can move on to another principle and again practice it “in my daily affairs”.



So here are the universal and loving principles contained in this prayer; love to overcome hatred, forgive in the face of a wrong, harmony in the midst of discord, truth instead of error or lies, faith in the depth of despair, light to cast out shadows, joy to overcome sadness, and a willingness to give comfort, understanding, love, self-forgetting and at last forgiveness. Perhaps you will journey through this prayer in the coming New Year and chose just one principle you would like to make your own. I write in service to you, my fellow alcoholics and sincerely wish you happiness in 2016.

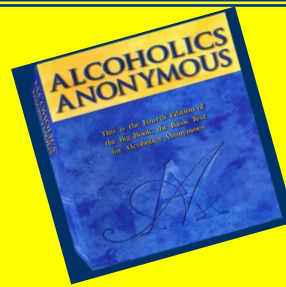

Before THE day in June 1958, I had been a wonderfully rational, hard-working, loving-mother-of-my-children, woman. Also a miserably unhappy one only because I was inflicted with an alcoholic husband. He got into AA. And I was still miserable.



Along came THE DAY when I found myself so miserable, so lonely, so weak and tired I could hardly drag myself out of bed. Why this was so, I did not then know. But the final agony was that for me there was no beauty in this day, no love in this day, no desire to live. I knew something awful was wrong. . .I was missing everything worth while in life. . .dying.

With these thoughts racing thru my mind, I suddenly saw my true problem with blinding clarity. I just couldn't stop laughing! This bolt, or whatever it was, had surely unhinged me, I thought! I felt like running and leaping for pure joy; I felt like loving EVERYONE with a joyous and free loving; I felt like singing at the top of my lungs with pure happiness, I felt like nothing I had ever experienced before.

From that first step I have come to see other miracles: The one big one is Love. The love my beloved husband and I now have and the ever widening circle of love for so many others-- always returned to us in many, many ways. There is always the miracle of my complete release from alcohol--I have never had a thought or desire for a drink--a fact I must accept with wonder, gratitude and love.

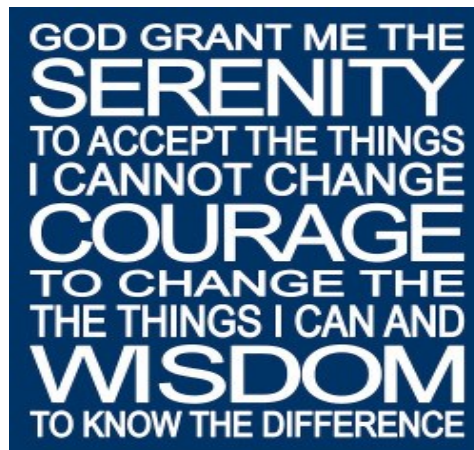

The Origin of our Serenity Prayer

For many years, long after the Serenity Prayer became attached to the very fabric of the Fellowship's life and thought, its exact origin, its actual author, have played a tantalizing game of hide and seek with researchers, both in and out of A.A. The facts of how it came to be used by A.A. a half century ago are much easier to pinpoint.

Early in 1942, writes Bill W., in A.A. Comes of Age, a New York member, Jack, brought to everyone's attention a caption in a routine New York Herald Tribune obituary that read:



(Attributed to Reinhold Niebuhr)

Everyone in A.A.'s burgeoning office on Manhattan's Vesey Street was struck by the power and wisdom contained in the prayer's thoughts. "Never had we seen so much A.A. in so few words," Bill writes. Someone suggested that the prayer be printed on a small, wallet-sized card, to be included in every piece of outgoing mail. Ruth Hock, the Fellowship's first (and nonalcoholic) secretary, contacted Henry S., a Washington D.C. member, and a professional printer, asking him what it would cost to order a bulk printing. Thus came the popularity of this prayer with our AA programs
