

HEARD IT THROUGH THE GRAPEVINE MAY 2016..... I enjoyed the refreshing honesty in the story "A Prayer for Jim" from our April, 2016 Grapevine Magazine. Jim H. writes of his early sobriety: "After about two weeks, I

was at the terrible spot many of us find ourselves; I was feeling better and I wasn't feeling the heat quite so much. Perhaps I was making too much of this deal but I really did like the people and the feeling I got around them. I came to a turning point. Should I continue going to so many meetings or should I cut back? Should I stay or should I go?" How many of us have shared these same feelings, no matter the length of our sobriety? We could be one month sober and free of immediate crises, or twenty years sober and living a curiously routine life of recovery and still question what part alcohol plays in our lives. "Should I stay or should I go?"

Jim H. answers as follows and surprisingly, it is more about our lives and less about the alcohol. "I decided to stay and try AA. I learned that improving the quality of my relationships was much more important than any money or influence I might get. I found that spirituality was not just in the number or fervor of my prayers. It was also in the manner in which I treated God's Children: showing them love and service may be even more important demonstrations.... I'm even more convinced 24 years later that the path to spirituality lies in my willingness to love rather than be loved." We all may echo the same thought at some time: Should I stay or should I go? We are alcoholics struggling with a lifelong addiction to alcohol and sometimes I just plain get very tired of it. But then I recall whose grace led me to this way of recovery, whose watchful care keeps me sober, and all the amazing gifts I would never have received if I was not sober. Today I will stay.

I have an addictive personality. Earlier in my life, food was my drug of choice. I did not know that I ate to numb the pain. I needed to lose 100 pounds so the doctor suggested a gastric bypass procedure. I lost the weight but did not lose the addiction. I transferred it to alcohol and became alcoholic in 3 years. With the alcohol came lots of men and cigarettes. I did not know I was trying to fill a God shaped hole with things of this world.




After years of losing everything I owned and almost losing my life, I checked in to a recovery house. I had nowhere else to go. I finally was willing to work the Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous and get serious about my recovery. I quit looking for the easier, softer way. I surrendered completely.

I found God and my Higher Power who took away the terrible compulsion to drink. My self esteem returned and the slutty behavior left. A few years later, I was able to quit smoking with God's help. I know that unless I learn why I drank and allow God to remove the flaws I would only transfer my addiction to something else. The drinking was only a symptom of the terrible disease.

I am seeing the promises come true in my life because I have worked and continue to work for them. God did it for me and and He will do it for you, too, if you ask Him.

There are four basic things that produces effective sponsorship. They are: Listen, Learn, Love, and Lead. Let's consider these one at a time.

Listen--I must listen closely to what the sponsee is saying, remembering that they are sick people. If I listen closely, they will tell me many things about themselves. Most newcomers have never had someone who would listen and not condemn or criticize them for expressing their feelings and thoughts.

Learn--I can learn by listening for deep-seated resentments, anger and fear. I can learn much about their drinking history, family and what false beliefs they may have acquired about how to live life. From my mistakes, I can learn how to be a better sponsor in the future.

Love--Practicing unconditional love toward the sponsee is essential for me as a sponsor. I should be kind, patient, not boastful for rude, not self-seeking or easily upset. I should encourage them as they make progress in the Steps and, when the difficult times arrive and they have an emotional upset, be compassionate and suggest, "Don't quit five minutes before the miracle happens." It is very important that I tell them the truth in a loving way and I must let them know that "I care more about saving their life than I do about hurting their feelings."

Lead--"The basis of all sponsorship is to lead by example. Service sponsors can impart to their sponsees the pleasure of involvement in the work of Alcoholics Anonymous. This is best done by stressing the spiritual nature of service work and by pointing out the usefulness of simple footwork and faith."
