FIRST THINGS FIRST

My first sponsor always stressed that her sobriety came first. I don't think I bought into this at first, but, in time, came to believe it was the rock of my program. My program of sobriety includes three meetings a week, working with a sponsor and sponsees, daily morning prayers and readings, checking in with an online women's AA group daily, opening a meeting once a month, and giving out my phone number from time to time.


I've noticed a trend in meetings lately that suggest to me want I DON'T want to do -- arriving late, whispering to others, talking out of turn, leaving the meeting to answer a cell phone that goes off during the meeting, checking messages and reading. I would suggest that those who feel they are multi-tasking (the new buzz word), are really not doing anything very well. What's important here?

Meetings remind me that I'm alcoholic and I need to work on my recovery. I need to be fully present. I can be easily distracted,

but I want to remember that staying sober is my number one priority. I may have to work harder to pay attention.


Another thing my sponsor told me was that G-d speaks to us through others in AA meetings. As one fellow says, "We can learn what to do and also what NOT to do.



During the past few weeks my thoughts have been directed more and more toward living in a more spiritual state of mind. I am the first to admit that one of my deepest character issues is my stubborn and consistent attitude that "I can take care of myself". To put it bluntly, I believe I can do it all without any help, I know all the right things, and of course, I know exactly what the next right thing is. Never mind that this alcoholic has been sober for 30 plus years and lived in AA rooms faithfully repeating the steps and AA language all this time. Well, something must have worn off on me because I finally get it, but just don't know how to do it.

What I'm talking about here is "Living In Faith" and yes it is very easy and simple to do in the company of other alcoholics for a period of 60 minutes when AA talk the talk and walk the walk are clearly shared. But you put me out in the real world and I revert to my very poor set of personal survival tools and I become totally interdependent. Time and time again I prove to myself that I really do need help, that I don't know all the answers and that I usually end up making bad choices when I rely only on myself.

I want to share a quote from the story "You're In For A Ride" in the July Grapevine magazine. The author reflects back on his life in sobriety and writes "Did I "earn" all this fun and happiness? I don't know. I do know that, as the Big Book says, "When we look back, we realize that the things which came to us when we put ourselves in God's hands were better than anything we could have planned." Once again the example of a simple life centered in grateful spirituality has rewarded the author and countless recovering alcoholics with peace, joy and happiness.

I appreciate your company as I wonder how to make my life more spiritually centered, how I can truly turn my will and life over to the care of a Higher Power as I understand him, and where I can gather the strength to sit guietly and listen for the answers. So too I hear this phrase which is repeated in practically every AA meeting. "The principles we have set down are guides to progress. We claim spiritual progress rather than spiritual perfection." Practice makes for progress and progress for me is one step farther away from myself and one step closer to a spiritually guide life. Wishing you joy in your sobriety!

When I was drinking alcoholically and before my Higher Power changed me, I was very dishonest. I would lie to you and swear to it. I would steal from you and help you look for it. Then I read that Honesty is the spiritual principle behind the First Step of Alcoholics Anonymous " We admitted we were powerless over alcohol- that our lives had become unmanageable."



I had trouble accepting the first step and as a result, I relapsed several times. I must be honest and take this step perfectly every day. BB How It Works, p.58 They are naturally incapable of grasping and developing a manner of living which demands rigorous honesty.

Nothing counted but thoroughness and honesty. BB pg 65 Belief in the power of God, plus enough willingness, honesty and humility to establish and maintain the new order of things, were the essential requirements. BB pg 13

When I had about 1 year of sobriety I heard an "Old Timer" share that he must continuously maintain rigorous honesty. He realized, doing a 10th step inventory ,that he was taking extra sweetener to use later for his cup of coffee from a fast food location. He found that he was actually stealing.

I was very surprised to hear this. I figured everyone did this. I took extra napkins to store in the car when I ordered food, extra sweetener,... and never really thought about it. I had to become rigorously honest in ALL of my dealings if I wanted success.

What I thought were small details were actually large defects that grow into even larger problems. I talked to my sponsor. The answer is always in the readings: 12&12 Step Seven, p.72 With a proper display of honesty and morality, we'd stand a better chance of getting what we really wanted.

I pray each morning to be honest in ALL of my dealings. Honesty is still the best policy. Sobriety is a GIFT I treasure. See you at a meeting soon. Shirley J (Winners/ Westside)
