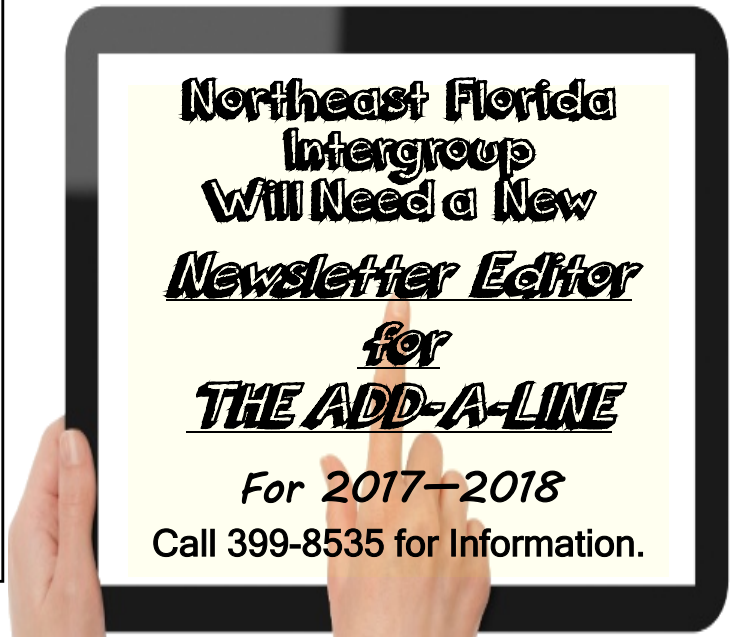
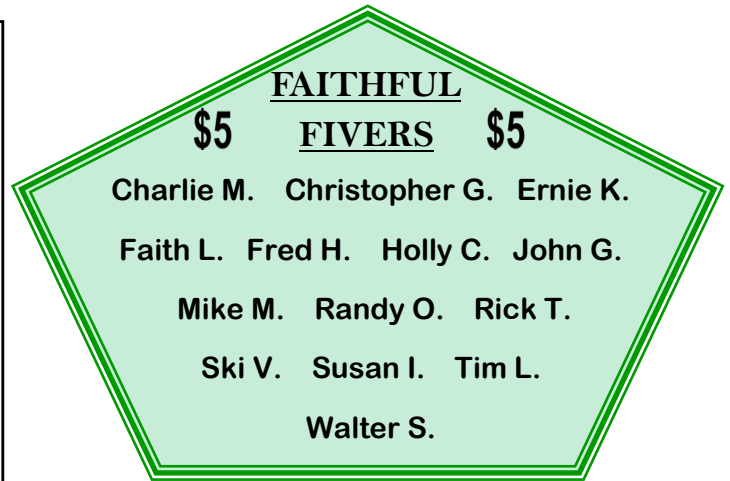

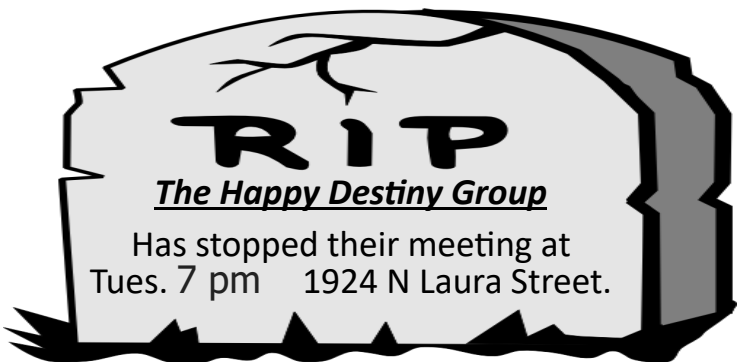

OCTOBER 2016 GRAPEVINE

Many times my fellow alcoholics have shared how they first came to AA. Some share glowing spiritual awakenings of having finally found the fellowship, understanding, and unconditional support the program offers at their first meeting. Others have come back to meetings again and again while at the same time, they were still unable to give up the insane desire to continue drinking. Still others never returned, only to remain locked in the prison and misery of alcohol. Why is it that some of us make it while others will never be free?

The story "When You're Ready" from the September 2016 Grapevine may contain one answer. The author meets a newcomer and writes *"I share my story and ask if she's willing to go to any lengths to get sober. She tells me again of her struggles, all the things being done to her, all that she has to handle, what she is dodging and avoiding....She asks if I can understand. I do understand."*

Don't we all understand? Haven't we all been there? Some of us are still there as once sober, the concerns and problems of life don't just disappear. But the author of the story persists. *"Again I ask, "Are you willing to go to any lengths to stay sober?" Excuses, rationalizations, justifications, victimization, martyrdom...I listen and I know."*

I believe the story contains one of the answers to our individual commitment to stay sober in that **we are willing to go to any length**. Personally, I despised my drunken self as she wasn't even recognizable any longer; nothing in my alcoholic life reflected the woman I had been once upon a time before I started drinking. And being so desperate, I really was ready, Ready To Go To Any Length.

I am grateful today that I can stand in the light of my Higher Power and go to any length to stay sober.

For too many years I wore so many masks. I projected a happy marriage, successful career, wonderful life. I was a great actress, I could be who you needed me to be My ego kept me in lies so that I was bound up in secrets. AA tells us that ego is Easing God Out and that is what I did. I heard that secrets can make us sick and we have seen secrets cause death. Pg 55 of 12 Steps and 12 traditions says: " But of the things that really bother and burn us, we say nothing. Certain distressing or humiliating memories, we tell ourselves, ought not to be shared with anyone. These will remain our secret. Not a soul must ever know. We hope they'll go to the grave with us." Unfortunately, many of us do take these secrets to the grave.



We don't have to. We can tell ourselves the truth. Illuminate secrets by being honest. What are we trying to hide and why?

If a secret causes anxiety and/or depression and we are self-medicating with drugs and alcohol, it's time to reach for help. On the surface, sharing can feel frightening, as though we are giving away power by telling another. But reaching out and conceding that we need help will open the possibility that another person may empathize and we'll feel less alone. Remember that we are not doctors and if you are depressed and have a chemical imbalance you may need to seek professional help and medication to be taken as prescribed.

Kick your ego aside and know that there are forces bigger than you at work. Don't be afraid to be vulnerable. Surrendering into vulnerability will open you up to an opportunity for hope. Hope allows us to believe we have a future.



Sometimes I forget that feelings are not facts. They are not right or wrong, they are just feelings and they will pass and change in time. I need to talk to my sponsor when I am in my head and making plans based on feelings. I must recognize that this is my disease that wants me dead. The committee in my head will lie to me. It may tell me to drink or, in some cases, my disease will tell me to kill myself. If I listen, I could choose a permanent solution based on a temporary problem.

There has been an epidemic of suicides in our community lately and even one is too many. Please, tell some one what you are feeling. Most of us have been there and we understand. If you can't talk to a friend call the phone army at the Northeast Florida Intergroup at 904 399 8535. It is manned 24 hours a day by alcoholics in recovery. They have saved many lives. There is also The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1 800 273 8255. I have called them and they do not judge. They are only there to listen and help.

Our Higher Power has given us a second chance at life through the 12 steps of Alcoholics Anonymous. It works if you work it. Ask for help from any one of us. Someone helped me and I have a debt to repay. Helping you keeps me sober and alive. It is a gift I cherish today.
