Why The Business Meetings are Important To You?

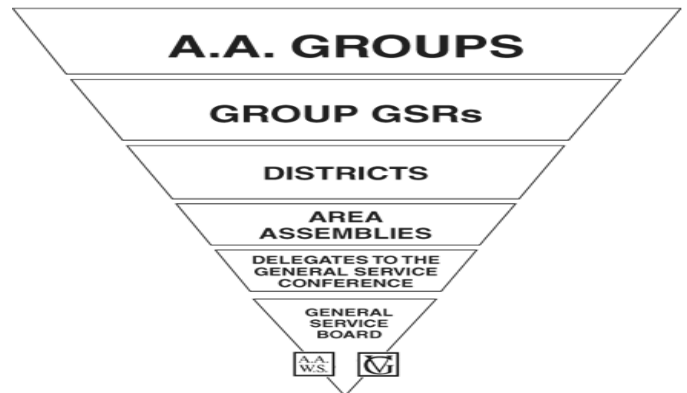
Issues come up that affect us all and our ability to fulfill our primary purpose.

Example: It was suggested that since the position of the Add A Line Editor was open and not being filled by a volunteer we should let the Add A Line go "Dark" until someone stood up to fill this position. Many of our members felt that was a "Service" vital to all of that it not be discontinued.

The alternative was to pay some additional hours (6-8 hours) per month (less than \$9.00 a hour) to continue the Add A Line. Some members felt that this was making this a paid position. The motion stated only to pay some minimal additional time to keep the service going for the next six (6) months, not to make this a paid position. That motion passed, and as a result, you are reading this article.

It is important to vote and understand that people on both sides of this issue are good people with the best interest of AA as a whole as their intent. After debate, an "informed" group conscious voted to continue the Add A Line under the limited conditions.

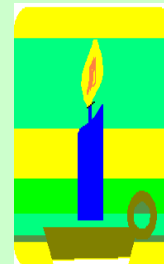

When told that our society has no president having authority to run it, no treasurer who can compel the payment of any dues, no board of directors who can cast an erring member into outer darkness, when indeed no AA can give another a directive and enforce obedience, our friends gasp and exclaim, "This simply can't be. There must be an angle somewhere." These practical folk then read Tradition Two, and learn that the sole authority in AA is a loving God as he may express himself to the AA group conscience. They dubiously ask an experienced AA member if this really works. The member, sane to all appearances, immediately answers, "Yes! It definitely does." The friends mutter that this looks vague, nebulous, pretty naive to them. Then they commence to watch us with speculative eyes, pick up a fragment of AA history, and soon have the solid facts and are convinced.
