

SETTING GOALS IN SOBRIETY



In sports like football, there is the ULTIMATE goal of winning the game. In sobriety, the game might be "won" by having a "spiritual awakening' and living the remainder of our lives out with peace and purpose. Within the game, there are mini-goals and milestones we set out to achieve. Teamwork, positive yards, timeouts, penalties have parallels to our journey in recovery. We have a playbook (Big Book) full of plays (steps) that executed well, in the correct order, groom us to be the very best we can be. We "move the chains" one day at a time and sometimes have to take negative yards or sit the bench, or just plain get knocked on our rear! But with our team-mates (sober network) and an experienced coach (sponsor) we can get back up and push forward to a win!

In early sobriety we are rookies in training and we may need to set smaller more realistic goals. As the fog lifts we sometimes have the expectation that all problems and consequences should magically resolve themselves, or that we are owed something for deciding to change our behavior. When those expectations aren't realized we are vulnerable to impatience, anger and resentments which can "sideline" our recovery or even cause a relapse. Gratitude and service are the spiritual exercises that strengthen and prepare us for adversity. Remember our disease is working out hard as well and we must keep in shape to gain more ground and defend it.

Old-Timer's say, "easy does it' for a reason. It's been my experience that "one-day-at-a-time," one chip at a time, my small goals make deposits on the ultimate goal of lifelong sobriety and serenity. Remember we are all in this together as a team! Choosing to get sober is a now goal. Recovery is a lifetime journey and setting, small realistic goals in early recovery can add up to a big win in sobriety!

Let's give our "service desks" the hand they so well deserve! ...We are beginning to see that our few paid workers are performing only those service tasks that our volunteers cannot consistently handle. Primarily these folks are not doing Twelfth Step work. They are just making more and better Twelfth Step work possible. Secretaries at their desks are valuable points of contact, information, and public relations. That is what they are paid for, and nothing else. They help carry the good news of AA to the outside world and bring our prospects face to face with us. That's not "AA therapy"; it's just a lot of very necessary but often thankless work.

So, where needed, let's revise our attitude toward those who labor at our special services. Let us treat them as AA associated, and not as hired help; let's recompense them fairly and, above all, let's absolve them from the label of professionalism.
