NEFL ARCHIVE COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2018

Corrections Volunteer Service Opportunity

My name is Bob C. and I take AA meetings into State Correctional Institutions. Most of Northeast Florida prisons are at the doorstep of Jacksonville and Gainesville. There is a dedicated team of people who take meetings to Lawtey CI, Baker CI, Union CI, New River CI, and various other work camps, to name a few. Also, several Districts have contributed money and literature to this effort and we all should be congratulated for the service that is being done. However, it is not enough.



The Department of Corrections does not allow AA meetings to be conducted without an outside member of AA being present. Also, as volunteers, we are not allowed to correspond with or visit individual inmates. As a result, most inmates get only one meeting a week and it is hard to find somebody to be their sponsor to guide them through the 12 Steps.

At New River CI, the Chaplain has organized a dorm called Faith and Character Dorm. The inmates can meet on their own and they want to incorporate a study of AA's 12 Steps. They need help regarding getting 12 & 12 literature, which has been arranged through our Northeast Florida Intergroup Corrections Committee (thank you very much!).

The facilitator of the dorm has asked me if I could get with groups and the Northeast Florida Intergroup of Jacksonville to get volunteers to correspond with them about the 12 Steps or basically be a sponsor. This does not mean having to come to the prison, going through security background checks, or getting fingerprinted. It would mean corresponding by mail (we are working on the email angle) and helping the inmates to do the steps. The inmate's mail will be monitored, which means a prison official will be checking their incoming and outgoing mail. For security reasons, you would not be using your home address. We are looking into a practical way for you to receive mail from the inmates.

I would like to remind everyone that the 5th tradition states, "Each group has but one primary purpose – to carry it's message to the alcoholic who still suffers." I would ask you what your sobriety would be like if you didn't have somebody to guide you through the steps or were getting just one meeting a week? I myself would find it very difficult to stay sober under those circumstances. The Corrections people of AA in Jacksonville need your help to carry out the spirit of the 5th tradition. Helping an inmate in their quest for sobriety is great service work, and a great way to help is to correspond with and guide a suffering alcoholic through the steps. I promise you will receive more than what you give.

GROUP HISTORY PROJECT.....Group Histories (GH) were collected throughout the year. We currently have information on 90 groups. This information is collected in a GH binder with single sheet histories and pictures of each groups meeting place. Pictures of GH pages are posted in the ADD-A-Line on a monthly basis which gives a brief history of the group an as well as pictures of the meeting place.

OLD TIMER INTERVIEW PROJECT.....This year there were 2 interviews recorded and 2 interviews transcribed, edited and published in the ADD-A-LINE. The published articles will also be posted on our web page. Each transcript is carefully edited to protect the anonymity of all AA members. We currently have a list of 41 members with more than 40 years sobriety who need to be interviewed. Equipment for the recording and transcription of the interviews is a problem and is being addressed.

"COFFEE CUP" CONVERSATIONS.....The AC discussed this project in December. Conversations will be conducted long timers to get a flavor of the Jacksonville fellowship in the early 1970s and forward.

ARCHIVAL DISPLAY CASES.....This year the IG office was upgraded with new furniture. As a part of this project two display cases were purchased for the use of the archives. A number of items are now on display for IG visitors to see.

THE GRAPEVINE COLLECTION.....
The Grapevine collection is now on display. The collection dates back to 1948. Also on display are nine Grapevine articles written by members of NEFL.

BOOK COLLECTION.....An inventory was taken of the books held in the archives. Each book has been put in a protective cover with an id number. These have been summarized in an index.

THE TREE PROJECT.....The Florida growth tree was produced in 1989 by some AA members to record the growth of AA in Florida. This project is trying to identify the dates of origin of all the meetings listed on the Florida growth tree. This research is ongoing and about 80% complete.

GSO DIRECTORIES COLLECTION.....Our directories collection have been filed by date and indexed.

THE BINDER COLLECTION.....This is the heart of our archives and consists of many hundreds of documents and letters relating to our history. Each document is stored in an acid free protective sleeve and we currently have four large binders with a comprehensive index. This is an active project.

ARCHIVE COMMITTEE PRESENTATIONS.....The AC made two presentations at the 4th Annual Archive workshop in February.

How May I Be of Service?

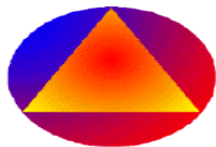

I am a federal employee and affected by the recent government shutdown. I've been through this before. During the last shutdown, I watched the news all day and worried when it would end, when I'd get paid again, what was I going to do?! This time, I have been given God's peace over the situation. I have absolutely zero control over what happens. I do have the choice over the actions I take though. I can either sit at home and let the insanity spiral of "what if's" overtake me or get off my butt and DO something.

My sponsor suggested volunteering at Intergroup with my new found free time. Knowing that service work is the key to sobriety, I called and was warmly welcomed to come volunteer.

It has been the highlight of my days. It has helped keep my routine up and get me out of the house. The best part has been talking to potential alcoholics and those in recovery. The first day I took a call and it was a crying, young woman saying she needed help with her drinking. I froze. I had to hand the phone off to better assist this suffering woman. It was a daunting reminder of how far I had come, and where I never want to be again.

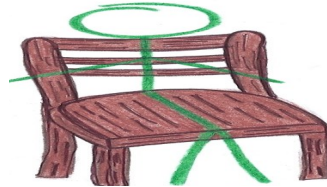

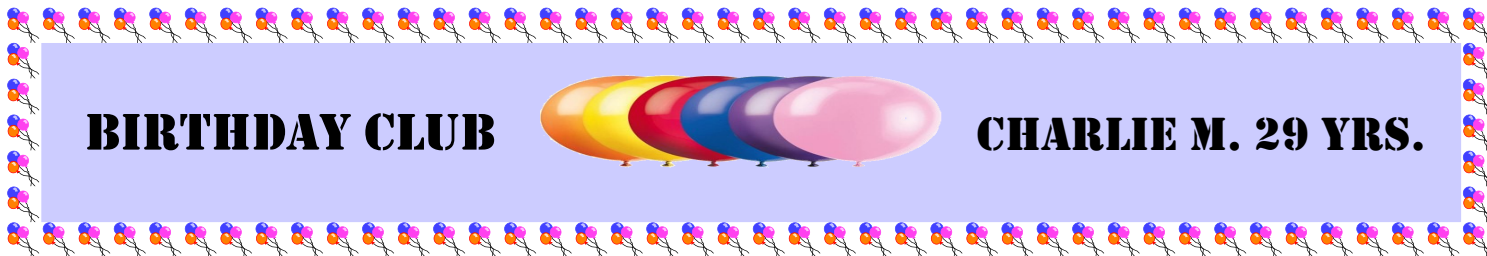
