

AA in the Time of the Covid19 Virus

The events of 2020 have required a major shift in the fellowship of the AA community. This has presented many problems as well as unique opportunities for all of us. We started the year with over 600 meetings per week in the Northeast Florida area. By early March all face to face meetings were shut down and we rapidly shifted to online meetings. We currently have over 110 local online meetings (see neflaa.org for list). While some groups have recently begun to have face to face meetings, online meetings will continue to be an important venue to carry the message for some time.

The members of the NEFL Archives Committee want to preserve the observations and experiences of members of the Northeast Florida community to give all of us a personal understanding of these times and provide future generations an accurate accounting of what we "old timers" experienced. The goal of the Archives committee is to develop a journal which includes the experiences of many interested members.

The Archives Committee started the project in mid-March. We began to journal the impact of Zoom meetings here in the NEFL area, and around the country. We hope you will join us in this historical moment for AA. We hope you will share your experience(s). As you participate in Zoom AA meetings, take a few notes to summarize your impressions and the impact the meeting had on you. What have you learned?

Some people may share about their home group and its evolution into the Zoom format and how they have progressed these last seven months. This is new territory to all in AA. We have always been face to face when we make our contacts with a cup of coffee in hand and a table to lean on. Now Zoom has put us on a PC (alcoholic square screen) or our i-phones. A very different approach to sponsorship and service is required. Have we succeeded in maintaining our health and ability to reach out and help those still suffering and needing help? GSO has been highly supportive of the switch to Zoom meetings. The Grapevine Magazine published two articles focusing on Zoom meetings in the October 2020 issue.

We are preparing a journal of impressions and experiences from personal points of view throughout this period. It is our hope to understand and document how we AA's lived in the time of Covid-19. How did it impact your program, what changed, what are you doing differently to "work" your program? Please send your comments to twicks41fl@gmail.com



Accessibilities Committee

Accessibility challenges apply to all alcoholics who have difficulties participating in Alcoholics Anonymous, whether those are mental, physical, geographic, cultural, or other factors that vary among people. Some of these alcoholics may experience barriers to accessing the A.A. message, including the literature, meetings, Twelve Step work, and the service structure. For the purpose of these guidelines in defining the accessibility issues that many alcoholics face, we refer primarily to persons who are blind or and/or deaf, have hearing and/or vision loss, those who are housebound or chronically ill, those who are living with the effects of brain injury or stroke, and many others who may have various kinds of abilities. Barriers to the message of Alcoholics Anonymous are not always readily evident. --A.A.® Guidelines for Alcoholics

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

The Principal of Rotation: Anonymity in Service

For many of us in the fellowship, service work is an integral part of our individual programs. Service work takes many simple forms, from reading at meetings, to making coffee at meetings, or sponsorship. There are also more formal kinds of volunteer service work, such as speaking at treatment centers, becoming a group officer, or being

involved in the behind the scenes running of the fellowship at the intergroup, district, or area level. In my last 8 years around the program my experience has brought me into many arenas of service. Today my service commitment involves taking meetings into an institution where the residents otherwise would have no access to our program.

One aspect of service work which is often overlooked, but suggested by our literature in order to incorporate the idea of anonymity in service is called the "principal of rotation". There is some written guidance on this idea contained in the AA pamphlet The AA Group: Where it all begins. On page 26 of that pamphlet it says: *The Principle of Rotation Traditionally*, rotation ensures that group tasks, like nearly everything else in A.A., are passed around for all to



share. Many groups have alternates to each trusted servant who can step into the service positions if needed. To step out of an A.A. office you love can be hard. If you have been doing a good job, if you honestly don't see anyone else around willing, qualified, or with the time to do it, and if your friends agree, it's especially tough. But it can be a real step forward in growth—a step into the humility that is, for some people, the spiritual essence of anonymity.

Among other things, anonymity in the Fellowship means that we forgo personal prestige for any A.A. work we do to help alcoholics. And, in the spirit of Tradition Twelve, it ever reminds us "to place principles before personalities."

Many outgoing service position holders find it rewarding to take time to share their experience with the incoming person. Rotation helps to bring us spiritual rewards far more enduring than any fame. With no A.A. "status" at stake, we needn't compete for titles or praise—we have complete freedom to serve as we are needed.

The idea is simple: People should rotate in and out of service in whatever capacity they serve, at the intergroup level, the group level or even simply chairing or speaking at meetings on a regular basis. It is easy to give in to the idea that "No one else will do it if I don't" or even more dangerous, "No one else will do it as well me". The fact is that there are a multitude of people who are willing to provide service and they come with varying degrees of ability. To deny individuals opportunities to serve by holding on to a particular service tasks can be selfish and egotistical, even if it appears there are no other qualified candidates. The fellowship and service structure will run with or without any one particular individual. My first sponsor used to tell me that in the grand scheme of things my life is about as significant as a grain of sand on the beach. It was my first insight into the meaning of anonymity. In the Twelve Steps Illustrated it further defines Anonymity as; "Sacrificing personal ambition for the common good." It can be easy to get caught up in self when performing service work and that is where the principal of rotation come into play. Lest our individual ego's become inflated with the notion that we are better than, we should always remember that we are simply drunks in AA; simply one of the many.

In the pamphlet "The Twelve Traditions Illustrated" it is written: Anonymity, as we observe it in AA, is at root a simple expression of humility. When we use the Twelve Steps to recover from alcoholism, we are each trying to achieve real humility, to put our self-respect on a solid basis of truth, rather than on fantasies about ourselves. When we use the Twelve Traditions to work together in AA, we are all trying to achieve humility: as individual members, by recognizing our true place in AA.

So for those in service to the fellowship please consider the spirit of rotation and how growth in humility can be can attained by stepping aside and letting others take the reigns. Even our founder Bill Wilson, wrote of his own personal struggles with this ego inflating pitfall in Pass It On . We should remember our slogan "Let go and let God".
