our co-founder Bill W. stated on page 319 of As Bill Sees It, "The A.A. Traditions are neither rules, regulations, nor laws. We obey them willingly because we ought to. Perhaps the secret of their power lies in the fact that these life-giving communications spring out of living experience and are rooted in love."

Recently, I have heard words bantered around that do not adhere to the Three Legacies of Recovery, Unity and Service.

Recovery – what if you are the only Big Book someone sees?

Unity – "Unity is the glue that holds the intergroup/central offices and general services together, but it is communication that jumpstarts mutual cooperation and harmony — vital both in reaching suffering alcoholics and in being attuned to the needs of those who are recovering in A.A." — Reprinted from **Intergroup/Central Offices: A.A.'s Front Line** — Box 459 – August/September 2007, with permission from A.A. World Services, Inc.

Service – This is a privilege. The more we give back, the more we receive.

And two other words need to be added – **Resentment and Safety.**

"Resentment is the "number one" offender. It destroys more alcoholics than anything else." Alcoholics Anonymous Big Book pg.64

Resentment is also defined as "bitter indignation at having been treated unfairly."

Safety – I read the Safety Card at the beginning of the meeting. Safety can mean more than concern for being mugged.

It is emotional and spiritual as well.

Step 5: Admitted to God, to ourselves, and another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

Tradition 5: Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity having but one primary purpose—that of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

Concept 5: Throughout our world service structure, a traditional "Right of Appeal" ought to prevail, thus assuring us that minority opinion will be heard and that petitions for the redress of personal grievances will be carefully considered.

SAFETY CARD FOR A.A. GROUPS: The General Service Office has made this optional card available as an A.A. service piece for in-person/online groups that wish to use it. Please feel free to utilize, choose a section(s) or adapt the text to your group's needs.

Tradition Five states: Each group has but one primary purpose — to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Any person seeking help with a drinking problem is welcome at this group. No A.A. entity determines an individual's membership in Alcoholics Anonymous. It is this group's conscience that if any person endangers another individual or disrupts the group's efforts to carry A.A.'s message, the group may ask that person to leave the meeting. This group strives to safeguard the anonymity of A.A. members and attendees; however, keep in mind that anonymity in A.A. is not a cloak for unsafe and illegal behavior. Addressing such behavior and/or contacting the proper authorities when appropriate, does not go against any A.A. Traditions and is meant to ensure the safety of all in attendance. The short form of Tradition One states: "Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity." Recognizing the importance of group unity, our group strives to create a safe meeting environment in which alcoholics can focus on achieving sobriety. "Safety and A.A.: Our Common Welfare" (SMF-209) at aa.org.

May 2, 1941 - Jacksonville, FL, newspaper reported start of a new AA group.

May 8, 1971 - Bill Wilson was buried in private ceremony, East Dorset, Vermont.

May 10, 1939: Clarence S announced to the Akron Oxford Group members that the Cleveland members were starting a meeting in Cleveland and calling it Alcoholics Anonymous.

May 11, 1935 - From the Mayflower Hotel, Bill Wilson called Walter Tunks who referred him to Henrietta Seiberling who introduced Bill to Dr. Bob.

May 12, 1935 - Mothers' Day - Bill Wilson and Dr. Bob Smith met for the first time in Akron, Ohio, at the home of Henrietta Seiberling.

May 19, 2000 - Dr. Paul O. died at the age of 83. His story, "Doctor, Alcoholic, Addict," was retitled "Acceptance Was the Answer," in the 4th edition.

May 29, 1980 - "Dr. Bob and the Good Oldtimers," AAWS biography of AA co-founder and a history of early Mid-west AA, was published.

May 31, 1938 - Bill and other AA's began writing the Big Book.

1942 - Richmond W., author of "Twenty-Four Hours a Day," had his last drink.

1950: Nell Wing became Bill W's secretary.




