# This Day in AA History

**1928:** Bill wrote promise to Lois in family Bible to quit drinking. By Thanksgiving added second promise.

**1936** - Bill C. a Canadian alkie staying at Bill's house, committed suicide using a gas stove.

**1939:** 1st central committee formed in Cleveland; 1st example A.A. rotation.

**1939** - Bill W. gets his drivers license

**1939** - Cleveland Plain Dealer begins series on AA by Eldrick B. Davis

**1944** - National Committee for Education on Alcoholism formed by Marty Mann - later to become "National council on Alcoholism."

**1945** - AA Grapevine adopted as national publication of AA

**1949** - Florence R, AA's 1st sober woman, begins drinking again, commits suicide

**1951** - Lasker Award presented to AA in San Francisco

**1951** - Sister Ignatia wrote "Care of Alcoholics - St. Thomas Hospital & A.A. Started Movement Which Swept Country" article in "Hospital Progress" the journal of Catholic Hospital Association

**1954** - The "Alcoholic Foundation" renamed the "General Service Board of A.A."

**1957** - Alcoholics Anonymous book A. A. Comes of Age is published

**1958** - Playhouse 90 TV airs "The Days of Wine and Roses"**1969:** 1st World Service meeting held in New York with delegates from 14 countries.

**1970** - Lois reads "Bills Last Message" annual dinner in NY

**1973** - Trustee's Archives Committee of AA has its 1st meeting

**1988** - Lois W, Bills wife and a co-founder of Al-Anon, dies at age 97. Lois is buried next to Bill in Manchester,

In 1939, St. Thomas became the first hospital in the country to establish a ward for alcoholics. In attendance at the opening ceremony was a small, frail nun trying to get her bearings. Sister Ignatia, a former music teacher, had transferred to St. Thomas Hospital after working in admissions at St. John's Hospital in Cleveland.

She would be hailed as "The Angel of Alcoholics Anonymous."

St. Thomas has served as an annual stop on Founders' Day when thousands of people visit Akron to celebrate the beginnings of Alcoholics Anonymous.

In 2006, Summa dedicated the Sister Ignatia Heritage Center and Chapel, a place to reflect, meditate and learn about the humble nun and AA.

Soon it will be dismantled. The stained-glass windows have already been removed and will be installed at the new Summa center at City Hospital.

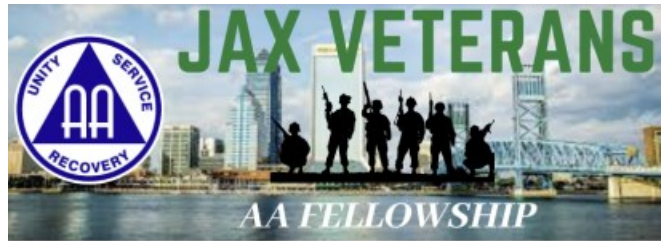

**Want to stay sober when you get out?**

The mission of the *Bridging the Gap* initiative in AA is defined quite tightly as: Helping those leaving Treatment Facilities make it to a set of 4-6 AA meetings, starting within 24-48 hours of release from the Facility. Such folks are *exceptionally* vulnerable to relapsing within that short timeframe.

Here you see a device like a bookmark. You can see a QR code on the device. A scan of that QR code leads to a form that asks for some very basic information from the person to be released. It works just fine on a mobile phone. The form itself is housed on the AA Intergroup website here in Jax: NEFLAA.org. We use that information to connect the person to an *AA Bridge the Gap Volunteer* prior to their leaving their Facility. When leaving a Facility, it is so very easy to overlook prioritizing the primary need to stay sober. The role of *Bridging the Gap* is to reach out the hand of AA to help folks maintain that priority.

Many folks leaving Treatment do not stay in Jacksonville. They return to home towns all over the country. We have refined the steps needed to put such people in the hands of *Bridge the Gap Volunteers* in other cities. In fact, that may be unique role for us.

But the QR code and our process work just fine here in town as well! Supplies of the bookmark are available at the Intergroup office.
