



## HISTORY OF INTERGROUP IN NORTHEAST FLORIDA 1961 to 2023

Back in 1961 and 1962, AA in the Jacksonville area had grown to nine groups including Fernandina and Jacksonville Beach. With this size, problems of where to call for information and 12 Step assistance arose. It was also apparent that some form of what is now the “When and Where” and the “Add-A-Line” were needed, but no group had the facilities (money) to take on the task. Finally, the need for a “public voice” to represent AA to the community was also vital.

AAs from different groups got together, outlined the problems, and discussed solutions. The idea of a central agency seemed to be the best solution. However, a central agency seemed to conflict with the Twelve Traditions particularly when “outside” (free) printing services were needed to print the Add-A-Line as well as a reduced rent for office space from a large office building downtown.

The problem was solved by the General Service Office in New York who told the committee that a central office was not an AA group in the strict sense of the Traditions and to go ahead as other cities had already done.

A steering committee made up of senior members of the fellowship was formed and Intergroup started. Consultations with General Services and other areas already having Intergroups developed the premise that an Intergroup Office was a business pure and simple and not an AA group. The steering committee acted as the “group conscience” in determining the extent of outside contributions and other actions.

An early treasures report (February 1963) shows an income of \$203.78 and expenses of \$203.65 including \$1.40 for salary of the secretary, \$30 for rent (downtown in The Florida Title Building) and \$17.65 for the telephone.

Some of the early names associated with Intergroup are Bill L. and Emmy E. from San Marco, Wynn and Gordon J. from the Beaches, Doug D. from Friendship, Charlie B. Lane S. and Clarence D. from Riverside, Thad W. from Arlington, Marion M. from Westconnett, Russel T. from Fernandina Beach. Lee L., the first secretary, was Helen R. followed by Hack I. One of the early treasurers from Ortega. Tom S., Phil H., Dayton T., Bill B., and Jonnie C. were also involved. The first Chairman was Bill L. followed by Gordon J., John Mc., Bill B. and Jack I. The office was moved to 1628 San Marco Boulevard in 1981 and then to its current location in 2004.

Sue G. was the chairman in 1986. Chairmen from 1993 to the present were Mike F., Gress L., Steve V., Mike J., Tom H., Harold H., Len L., Ken S., Charlie M., Ruth R., Beth J., Mike M., Carl G., Don P., Jack G., Kevin G., and Holly C.

To this day Over fifty years later, Intergroup continues to serve the needs of the groups, the community and the alcoholic. Activities are monitored by a committee made up of representatives from the individual groups. A Steering Committee oversees day-to-day activities.

**Open Meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous Welcome Everyone to the Fellowship**

(NEW YORK, February 2, 2023) A remarkable effect can take place in an Alcoholics Anonymous group meeting when an individual struggling with a drinking problem asks for help and someone is there to share with them that AA may be a solution. For some AA members, their journey of sobriety began at "open" AA meetings, which can be attended by any member of the community, alcoholic or nonalcoholic. Open meetings have long been a vital source of information for anyone who wants to learn more firsthand about the AA Fellowship. The only request is that attendees not disclose the names of AA members outside the meeting so that members' anonymity may be maintained.

A typical open meeting will have a "leader" and other speakers. The leader opens the meeting, introduces each speaker, then closes the meeting after sharing and discussion. With rare exceptions, the speakers at an open meeting are usually AA members. Each may share some drinking experiences that led them to join AA and they also may talk about how their life has changed because of the AA Fellowship and the Twelve Steps.

Open meetings are among the variety of meeting types offered by AA. "Closed" meetings are open to anyone with a desire to stop drinking, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, income, or profession. There also are AA meetings specifically geared toward groups, topics, and communities, such as, young people, men and women, beginners, meditation, LGBTQ+, and online, to name a few.
