Tradition 7: The A.A. groups themselves are supported by the voluntary contributions of their members. We think that each group should support this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds in the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly discouraged, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from individuals or of contributions carrying any obligation whatsoever. Then too, we view with much concern the accumulation of treasuries which continue, beyond prudent requirements, to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. The General Conference has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over procedure, money, and authority.

Concept 7: The Conference recognizes that the Conference and the Bylaws of the General Service Board are not legal instruments: that the Trustees are thereby authorized to manage and conduct all of the world service of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is further understood that the Conference Charter itself is not a legal document but relies instead upon the force of tradition and the A.A. purpose for its final effectiveness.




